
POTLUCK AND PRADO on the 1st Sunday of each month donations to Prado Day Center are collected, and potluck lunch follows 10:30 service.

Easter Season of Prayer

Presiding Bishop Michael Curry has called for an Easter Season of Prayer for regions in the Anglican Communion experiencing conflict and strife. Throughout the season, members of The Episcopal Church are asked to lift up in prayer parts of our world experiencing extreme violence and unrest. This Easter, Episcopalians will focus on Burundi, Central America, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, the Middle East, Pakistan, and South Sudan.



In calling for the Season of Prayer, Presiding Bishop Curry wrote, "In this season of Resurrection, I call on everyone to pray for our brothers and sisters in areas where there is much burden and little hope." Citing Galatians 6:2, "Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ," this season of prayer is an opportunity to learn more about what the churches in these regions are doing to be sources of support and hope, and to join with our brothers and sisters around the world in prayers for peace.

captures readers with the quiet beauty of her characters and their profoundly wrought experiences as immigrants in America. The story takes place in a run-down apartment building in Delaware, home to nine families who arrived in the States from various South and Central American countries, each looking to better the lives of the next generation. In alternating chapters, these men and

women share stories of how their adopted country has left its mark on them, for better and worse. With her cast of "unknown Americans," Henriquez has crafted a novel that is inspiring, tragic, brave, and above all, unforgettable.
