Pentecost



The Apostles were in Jerusalem that day for the Feast of *Shavuot* (meaning weeks), a pilgrim festival when all adult Jewish men gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the wheat harvest and give thanks for the goodness of God. Since it occurs 49 days after the first day of Passover (i.e. the 50^{th} day, including Passover itself), Hellenistic Jews gave it the name Pentecost (πεντηκοστή, or "fiftieth day"). And since 49 days equals seven weeks, it became a "week of weeks." Therefore, it was also called the Feast of Weeks.

Announcing a new Hollister Institute program:

Embracing an Adult Faith

Five weeks starting Thursday June 30 at 7pm

Join Caro+ in a small group discussion to revisit some of Christianity's most fundamental questions: Who is God? What does salvation mean? What place does Jesus hold in contemporary Christian faith? Each session of this five-week class will be introduced by a video of scholar Marcus Borg in dialogue with a small, diverse group of adults as they honestly — and sometimes painfully — confront the big questions and work together toward authentic answers. The video will be followed by our own discussions of the questions raised and questions and ideas of our own. There are no stupid questions and no locked in stone answers.

The five sessions cover God; Jesus; Salvation; Community and Practice

We all get to revisit our ideas about God and the world as our faith matures. This class will be helpful for those who have recently started worshiping at St. Benedict's as well as those who would like an opportunity to think more deeply together.

Discerning a Call to Ministry? Sign Up for June 11 "Discovery Day"

On June 11, the diocesan Commission on Ministry will sponsor its annual workshop on discernment, which offers the opportunity for those already engaged in active ministry to renew their call to a particular ministry or to explore <u>new</u> ways to respond to God's call.

"Discovery Day—Lay, Priest or Deacon?" is a required first step for anyone discerning a call to ordained ministry, but in no way is it limited to such individuals. We explore and celebrate the ministry of all the baptized and look at ministry development in each of the four orders: laity, deacons, priests, and bishops. We will include information about the opportunity for licensed lay ministries, a way to help people focus on and train for a particular area of ministry in the parish.

The workshop will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Salinas from 10 am to 3 pm. (9:30 coffee and gathering). Following the workshop, participants may choose to participate in a 12-week exploration called Inquirers Group to enhance their appreciation of how the four orders of ministry complement each other in fulfilling the mission of the Church, and to discern where they fit into that mission. **Note: Inquirers Group and Discovery Day are both required for those seeking ordination.**
