## May 19th Parish Council Meeting Highlights:

- We welcomed Ken Kenyon and Rod Morse to the vestry as newly appointed members to complete the terms vacated by Elaine Goodman (Ken) and Jo Oliver (Rod).
- We were able to sell some of the stock we were given (when the price went up briefly) and are using just over \$250,000 to pay down the bank loan.
- The new audio-visual system for the sanctuary will be installed in June.
- The county is requiring that we remove all the pipes from the aborted fire sprinkler system OR complete installation. Without an installed system we will not be able to expand or build anything else on the property. We are sending a letter of intent to remove the existing system, but right now we are researching the current cost of completing the installation before our permit expires in 2018.
- We have hired Adrienne Harris as a consultant to help us develop long-term plans for the building and grounds, e.g. columbarium, parking lot expansion, etc.
- The Abundance Shop will be moving to a larger, single-story building further down 9th Street. The lease starts July 1.
- We are hoping that on Saturday July 9th we can celebrate both St Benedict's Day and the completion of the Great Room project.

### *Proper 4: Sunday closest to June 1—Year C*

Welcome to our parish. As we take up the Gospel of Luke, which we began reading after Epiphany, Jesus has completed the teaching called "the sermon on the plain" and we begin to hear of stories about his ministry, especially healings. A Gentile centurion asks Jesus to heal his slave. That Jesus would deal with a centurion and that the centurion would care about the health of a slave were both surprising. God's care for all people is revealed in this story.

The first reading reflects what was a new concern for Judaism after the Exile (even though the story is of Solomon long before). The Torah had commanded Israel to care for the strangers in their midst but now the foreigners are to be called into membership in Israel. Centuries later, this class of God-fearing Gentiles was an important group in the missionary work of the early church.

The inclusion of Gentiles within the church was a painful issue. Paul's letter to the Galatians, which we begin reading today, is largely concerned with the controversy this raised for Christians. The Judaizers (Christians who insisted that only Jews could be baptized) were troubling the church in Galatia. Paul insists that the gospel is for all people. Those who claim otherwise are preaching a false gospel.

We gather in Eucharist to proclaim the universality of God's love for all people: a foretaste of our being gathered into the eternal joy of God's Reign. We are sent forth to call all people into this family and to minister to all in the name of Christ.
