We are lagging \$5000 behind budget: everyone is reminded to use the Amazon portal on the St Ben's website (www.stbenslososos.org) in order for us to get \$\$ back on your purchases. 2. We are still waiting for final numbers on the installation of a fire sprinkler system in order to comply with county regulations. We can extend the current building permit to install the system but we expect the final quotes to be \$80 -100k. 3. We agreed to continue our non-profit property tax assessment for this year (July 1 - June 30) as we don;t have the \$5k needed to do otherwise. This will limit the use of the church building. 4. We have not been able to re-amortize the bank loan because there is \$14k outstanding on our property taxes, pending the Nature Academy being able to get a state exemption. We will ask the Tax Assessor to provide a letter to the bank explaining the situation. In the meantime we are paying the loan off faster, but we have not been able to implement the budget agreed at the Parish Meeting which increases the Rector's compensation to ¾ time. 5. Next year is our 30th Anniversary and we plan to celebrate. 6. Speaking of celebrating, the menu at our annual Gratitude Dinner on Oct 21 will include tri-tip.
