# Lectio Divina with Isaiah

Lectio is not Bible study, but a kind of prayer. Lectio is not learning what the words means, but listening for the Word that gives meaning.



#### Lectio for December 12 - 16

Monday Isaiah 2:2 Tuesday Isaiah 2:3 Wednesday Isaiah 2:4 Thursday Isaiah 2:5 Friday Isaiah 11:9

**Read the passage slowly**, silently or aloud. Take a few minutes for silent reflection, and identify the words that speak to you.

**Read the passage a second time,** and listen to the text again. Ask yourself, "How does this speak to my life today?"

**Read the passage a third time,** and ask yourself, "What do I believe God wants me to be...or do? Is God inviting me to change in any way?"

**Conclude with prayer** (not a prayer of words, but a time of remaining open to the Spirit who speaks through the *lectio*).

Make a record of the thoughts, images, and insights that came in your time of prayer.
