### **Call for Mentors!**

Some of you will remember that Sister Theresa of Restorative Partners spoke at St Ben's a couple of years ago about the work they are doing helping people in County Jail and Juvenile Hall to create new lives so that they can become fully functioning members of the community. Recently Restorative Partners opened two sober living houses (one for men, one for women) in Los Osos. These are primarily for people returning to the outside after a period in jail. It can be difficult to readjust to normal life, especially when being clean and sober means not being in touch with your old friends. Restorative Partners is looking for people who would be willing to create a friendship with one of these people, helping them integrate back into society in a whole new way. I am hopeful that if several members of St Ben's were to get involved in this way we might be able to develop and ongoing relationship with the two houses, perhaps sharing some social events, inviting them to church etc. If you think that God might be prompting you to get involved and you want more information, please let me know.
