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#### **Dear Friends:**

How exciting it is to see the Great Room taking shape! After years of hoping, imagining, planning and giving, the church building is finally being completed. I am so grateful to everyone who has given sacrificially to make this possible, especially Jim Thompson, Maria Kelly and Michael Lucas. Without their skills and energy we would be in a completely different place.



Sometimes I think our journey together is like hiking; you see the top of the hill and you work hard to get there, imagining how it will be to get to the top and enjoy the view, but when you reach the "top" it turns out that there's another crest beyond it and the top is still some way off. Even as we reach this major goal and celebrate the completion of the Great Room, there is another goal appearing.

The county has decided that if we are to ever build further on the property we must install the fire sprinkler system. One was partially installed but then it proved to be very expensive, and

the fire marshall said we could go without so we abandoned the plan. As yet, we don't know what the cost would be to reinstate it at this point. Which brings up questions about how God wants us to use the building and the land for his greater purposes.

Many of you have great, creative ideas about things we could do to further develop it and so we are now working on a plan for the future which will guide the way we continue to make St. Benedict's a beautiful place for God's worship and service. If you haven't completed a survey there are still some at the back of the church and it's available online so please do that straight away.

But even more important than how are we to be wise stewards of what we have been given, is the question of how we are to serve God in our community. The Abundance Shop is our main ministry. It is here that we share God's love in conversation and through the sharing of the community's abundance. We are making an investment in this ministry by moving to a larger, somewhat more expensive store. I ask you too to make an investment in it

You can do so in the obvious ways; by donating good usable items, and by volunteering to help sort and stock, or welcome our guests and operate the cash register. You can also visit the store yourself, and mention it to your neighbors. Most importantly I ask you to pray regularly for the Abundance Shop, that it may be an expression of God's love to everyone who comes in and even those who drive pass; and that God will provide all our needs, especially for people from the congregation to volunteer and to find in doing so what a vibrant and engaging ministry it can be.

I look forward to continuing this next part of our journey together – to the top of the next peak!

#### **Finances**

We started the year with a deficit budget – in other words we planned to spend more than we expected in income, and so far the year is living up to expectations. We are spending a lot of money on completing the Great Room, repairing the veranda and installing the audio-visual system. This is all money that we have in hand, but it means that our cash reserve is dropping very fast.

Moving the Abundance Shop is both expensive – think deposit, double rent for a month, new fixtures etc., and the new shop will cost more. But it's bigger and all on one floor so we hope in the long run it will bring in as much if not more income and we will be more able to serve the people of Los Osos with God's love.

However, the cost of moving means that we expect lower proceeds from the shop this year and that is an expense



we had not considered in our budgeting. Please pray that God will continue to abundantly meet all our financial needs.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed to the Blessing the Future Campaign. Every penny you give goes immediately to repay principal on the bank loan. In addition we have sold some of the gift of stock – when it went above \$15 per share – and have used this to repay over \$250,000.

## **Highlights from the Parish Council Meeting**

We have had a meeting with the Tax Assessor's office and discovered that we need to be much more careful to fall within their guidelines if we want to be exempt from paying property tax. There will be a special Parish Council meeting on July 5 at 7:15 to discern the Holy Spirit's leading in this matter.

An Endowment Committee has been formed and they are moving ahead with completing all the policies necessary to set up the Endowment Fund. This will provide a way to create a fund which will continue way into the future. Money donated will be invested through the Episcopal Church Foundation and only the interest and any appreciation from the investment may be used each year.

## New Audio-Visual system

The white things on the sanctuary walls are new projectors. Thanks to two very generous gifts, we have had an audio-visual system installed which will enable us to show films and run the sound through our speaker system. This will make it possible for us to have more professional presentations especially for Hollister Institute classes as the sound will be good and the projectors are strong enough that we don't have to close all the blinds.

We also took the opportunity to move the antenna that runs the assisted listening system so that should be stronger and to reset all our sound levels.

## St. Benedict's Blessing the Future Campaign: Vision Plan 2017-2037

Now that our church building is almost complete, we are looking to the future by creating a Vision Plan for the building and land at St. Benedict's. We want to ensure we have a plan in place to help us create worship and community spaces that will serve our congregation and the community for the next 20 years. With a plan in place, we will be poised and ready to take full advantage of future gifts and to develop the Blessing the Future Campaign.

The project kicked off in June with a survey and brainstorming meeting with the congregation. Members voiced their ideas of what they envision St. Benedict's will need. We also collected ideas from church documents to create a list of items for the congregation to consider in July.

As the next step in the process, all ideas generated will be on display at St. Benedict's for prioritization. Parish members voiced their ideas. Now we are asking members to consider what their top priorities are from the list. Between July 3 and 17, there will be posters in the church listing the ideas for the building, the grounds, and possible future buildings at St. Benedict's. We hope you will take time to look at the list and vote for your top 5 highest priorities. Only the top priorities that are most feasible will be fleshed out for the draft and final Vision Plan.

A draft plan will be released in September for congregation members to review. The final plan will be released in October. Please include your voice in the process. Help us craft a coherent plan of how to use the land that God has blessed us with.

## **Church Safety Training**

On July 30, there will be an opportunity to attend two training sessions which are required for all church leaders. These will be held at St Barnabas' in Arroyo Grande. A donation of \$10 for one course or \$15 for both includes a light lunch and refreshments. Please let Danna know if you plan to attend.

- Safeguarding God's Children (9am-12n00n) is required for all those working with children and has to be renewed every three years. It can also be done on-line.
- Safeguarding God's People (1pm 3pm) is required for all vestry members and anyone who visits others in their homes on behalf of the church.

## Giving to St Benedict's

There will be plenty of time for quiet personal reflection.

The retreat house is very close to the Santa Barbara Mission and just across the road from a small park. Accommodation is in shared rooms with a bathroom just down the hallway. (<a href="http://mount-calvary.org/">http://mount-calvary.org/</a>) The retreat starts on Friday with supper at 6pm but you can arrive any time after 3pm, and it concludes after lunch on Sunday. ### Abundance Shop: A New Home

The Abundance Shop is getting ready to move to new quarters! In May we learned that a building we have been looking at for some time was going to become available. With the concurrence of the Parish Council, negotiations were begun with the landlord and a lease taken. The new location is at 2025 9<sup>TH</sup> Street diagonally across the street from La Casita restaurant. It is substantially larger and all on one floor which will benefit both volunteers and cus-

tomers. We look forward to being able to provide a more accessible shopping environment for our customers along with a better working environment for our volunteers. Currently there are some renovations being done to make the bathroom accessible for the disabled and there will also be some work required to be able to mount some of the Abundance Shop fixtures. However, we expect to be fully operational in the new location by mid-July.

I am pleased to announce that the Abundance Shop again participated in the SLO NOOR FOUNDATION Annual Thrift & Consignment Store Fashion Show held on June 26th. The shop donated an outfit which was worn by the mistress of ceremonies.



Abundance Shop revenues for the second quarter have been good. As a result the shop has been able to support much of the costs involved with the relocation with the help of several donors who stepped forward to assist.

However, there has been an effect on disposable income and the shop was only able to contribute \$ 1,000 to St. Benedict's on June 26.

A new location with additional space offers opportunities to review and improve the way the Abundance Shop operates. We are looking for additional volunteer help both customer facing such as cashiers and in the back office. Welcome interest/skill sets include: pricing, display/merchandising and repair/renovation. We are dependent on a group of dedicated volunteers and could not operate without them and we welcome interest from all. ## EarthCare Plans for Creation Sundays in the Fall

St. Benedict's EarthCare group met on Wednesday, June 8, and discussed how to support Caro's still evolving plans to observe what many congregations now call "Creation Sundays", viz., the Sundays from late September through mid-October, by focusing our congregation on the spiritual dimensions of environmental and climate concerns. Caro has asked for and received permission from Bishop Mary to go ahead with this project. The EarthCare group therefore discussed recommendations by Joe Morris, Barry Turner, and Bob

Pelfrey that a series of presentations be built around two classic videos dealing with cosmology, Brian Swimme's "Journey of the Universe", and a video by Dr. Joel Primack and his wife, Dr. Nancy Abrams, titled: "View from the Center of the Universe." Both films stress the incredible beauty of the emergent view of the expanding cosmos, including the implicit challenge to people of Faith to match our theology and practice with this remarkable new and expanding vision of what God's Creation means.

To accompany these two films, the group agreed to forward the suggestion that the book "Care for Creation", by Franciscan theologian Ila Delio, be used as the basis for ongoing discussions for all of the sessions. Caro will take these suggestions along with those from other members of the congregation into account as she moves forward with St. Benedict's "Creation Sundays" plans. EarthCare will also continue to discuss this issue in future meetings, including suggestions involving how some concrete "action topics" might result from the various discussions and activities.

Alice Welchert then reported to the group about her attendance at a late May San Luis Obispo Counting Planning Commission meeting at which the commission—overruling their own staff recommendation- voted 3 -2 to grant approval to the "oil trains" route through our county. She explained that the vote is "tentative", viz., it will be revisited in September. She also noted that this vote was taken before the June 3d oil train spill in the Columbia River resulting from the derailing of some 96 cars. Large fires as well as neighborhood evacuations resulted. Fortunately, there were no deaths involved. Alice recommended that Earth-Care provide more specific information to our congregation on details of this issue as it moves towards the September decision point, including information on how to contact the Planning Commission on this issue.

The group also discussed the ongoing environmental problem of invasive plants, an issue which is affecting the entire Los Osos area and St. Benedict's property itself (e.g., mustard plant and Veldt grass, among others). Joe Morris agreed to contact the California Native Plant Society (CNPS) to see if a speaker might be available to come to St. Benedict's to address the issue). The group also discussed the practical problems involved in trying to eliminate these plants from our property, an effort that could make St. Benedict's a kind of "plant refuge", and also symbolize our congregation's commitment to honoring the many ways that the environment is under threat. Discussion of this issue will continue in future meetings.

Finally, the group enjoyed Joe Morris' description of a "Locavore" lunch that he once attended, sponsored by a Quaker group. A Locavore is involve "omni" (unlimited selection of) food products grown "locally". The fun of the Locavore, besides supporting local food producers, includes the individual recipes on display for sampling as part of the lunch itself. This, too, will be discussed at further meetings.



Reminder: the EarthCare group meets on the second Wednesday of the month at 2:30 at St. Benedict's. You do not have to "join" the group to attend meetings. Individuals who are not members of St. Benedict's are also welcome to attend.
