#### Proper 16: Sunday closest to August 24—Year B

Welcome to our parish. The teaching of Jesus which caused the greatest offense to his disciples was his discourse on himself as the bread of life. When he extended that beyond a spiritual feeding to a sacramental feeding, "My flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed," many of his followers left him. The inner group, "the Twelve," were also disturbed, but through Peter they reaffirmed their faith.

The first reading today is the account of Israel's reaffirmation of their covenant with God, originally made at Mount Sinai. The people are called to an unswerving commitment to God alone.

We complete our reading of the Epistle to the Ephesians today. Paul calls on us to find our strength in God to stand up against the powers that oppose God's will and plan. We are to live in that strength and to persevere in prayer for all people.

We are called to be a people who belong to Christ. This call is often in direct conflict with our own wishes, habits, or opinions. We gather in liturgy as more than passive hearers and observers. We gather to enter into an encounter with God in Christ, which will remake us as people of God's kingdom.

#### Highlights from the Parish Council Meeting of Thursday August 13th:

- John Cribb reported that speakers for the organ are desirable. Not to amplify, but to diffuse a fuller, richer sound throughout the sanctuary. Currently, the organ has one speaker, in front of the organist's knees. For one speaker to project, the volume needs to be high, and the resulting sound is not ideal. The cost is about \$7k. Parish Council voted that this was a worthy project, but that now was not the time to pursue it.
- Maria Kelly reported that repair and painting of the veranda will be a large project, not just a
  small repair. The pickets and lower railing must be replaced completely. They are made of an
  inferior grade of lumber, not suitable for exterior uses. A joist under the veranda must be
  replaced, as well. It was agreed to get this replaced but to hold most other work until
  construction is completed.
- Construction of the Great Room: Michael Lucas will submit the permit to the county this week; hopeful that construction will start in September for completion as early as March.
- Fundraising through sales of St. Benedict's butter cookies will begin at the Jazz Concert on Sunday August 23rd. Anne Kanter will be baking, with help from Barbara Schippers.
- Following input from the Parish, the parish mission-slogan was agreed to be "Feeding Mind and Soul."
