Seeing Creation through the Eyes of the Mystic

Join us to explore the world of creation through the eyes of people of mystical vision. Thursdays in September, 7-8:30pm

John Muir (Sept 21), who is best known for his exploration of the Sierra Nevada, founding of the Sierra Club and championing of wilderness areas. wrote,

"The sun shines not on us but in us. The rivers flow not past, but through us. Thrilling, tingling, vibrating every fiber and cell of the substance of our bodies, making them glide and sing. The trees wave and the flowers bloom in our bodies as well as our souls, and every bird song, wind song, and tremendous storm song of the rocks in the heart of the mountains is our song, our very own, and sings our love."

Long-time Sierra Club outings leader, Joe Morris, discusses the life of John Muir—especially his years in Yosemite in the 1870s. He will recount Muir's personal transformation into a wilderness visionary and founder of the environmental movement in America. Joe has visited Muir's boyhood home in Scotland, his residences in California, and has hiked in many of Muir's favorite places.

Bishop is a public-defender and anti-death penalty advocate who challenged herself to the journey of transformation and healing. Sister Helen Prejean, author of Dead Man Walking says of Jeanne: "The criminal justice system in the United States, which deems some people unworthy of redemption --even children who commit serious crimes --urgently needs to hear voices that speak for mercy and restoration.
