Through the Dark Night with John of the Cross

A webcast with James Finley: *Thursday*, January 11th - 10am and 7pm In a webcast originally broadcast on the Feast of St. John of the Cross, James Finley explores the 16th century Spanish mystic's life and writings. John went through a purifying process of the Dark Night of the Soul. His description of this experience helps us navigate our own times of darkness and unknowing, coming to a profound knowing of God's presence in our lives. Through reflections on John's texts. Ascent of Mount Carmel, The Dark Night of the oul and Spiritual Canticle, Jim shares how our powerlessness in prayer is gradually transformed into contemplative intimacy with God. John believed that Infinite Love is the architect of our hearts. We are made in such a way that nothing less than an infinite union with Infinite Love will do. The Dark Night deepens our desire and openness to this love.

Identity 2018 A Bible study invitation from Bishop Mary

As a new church year dawns, Bishop Mary Gray-Reeves is inviting all leaders in the diocese to consider sharing in Bible study with their congregations, and those with whom they gather for committees and commissions of the diocese.

"The theme for 2018 is Identity." Bishop Mary says. "In my convention address I noted that faith is the centerpiece of our identity and reconciliation the activity of our identity. In this selection of readings, these themes can be explored, with some displaying the complexity and practice of our theme more obviously than others. As well, I have sought to move around the Bible more widely than in previous years so that we might encounter stories and teachings that we might not otherwise consider."

If using the format of Lectio Divina, some possible questions include:

- How do you understand or experience faith and reconciliation more comprehensively in the characters and teaching of the text?
- What is the text inviting you personally to consider about your identity as a Christian?
- What action in your life or the congregation's might be included in the invitation?
- How can you share the Good News offered in this time together?

"May we have a holy year of study together," states Bishop Mary. "May our faith be deepened and empowered. May our calling to be faithful witnesses to Jesus Christ and his work of reconciliation be strengthened in every way, and may our lives give God the glory."
