Storytelling and Faith to Headline May 19 Spring Conference

Save the date for the diocesan Spring Conference on Saturday, May 19, at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Salinas. The conference will focus on the Beloved Community Story Sharing Campaign, a project conceived to support the Presiding Bishop's strategic path called "Becoming Beloved Community: The Episcopal Church's Long-term Commitment to Racial Healing, Reconciliation and Justice."

This learning day is an interactive workshop with two parts. First we will learn about story, narrative, and myth and how they function in our faith. We will consider what the stories, narratives, jokes, and tropes we repeat say about who we are and how we understand God in our church. In part two, together we will engage our spiritual imaginations and learn how storytelling can redefine evangelism and facilitate racial reconciliation. Conflict Management and Mediation Training

Saturday, April 28, at St. Stephen's

Training for Conflict Management and Mediation in the Church is coming in April, at three locations across our Diocese. In our deanery, it will be held on Saturday, April 28 at St. Stephen's, 1344 Nipomo St., SLO.

This introduction to conflict management is based upon a facilitative model used in courts and community mediation settings. The objective is to recognize conflict when it occurs, to hone listening skills, and to discover the interests that lie behind the positions people take in conflict situations. We teach people how to foster a safe environment so that the true intentions and interests can emerge so that true problem-solving can occur. A discussion will follow examining the uniqueness of disputes in the church or parish setting, and then explore fact scenarios and role plays. The goal is that church leaders will gain new tools to use in order to convene and facilitate difficult discussions before they escalate.

The trainers: Bill Shelby is an educator at CSUMB and is a professional mediator. Jackie Pierce is an attorney and runs the Mandell Gisnet Center at the Monterey College of Law and a professional mediator.
