Eucharistic Minister & Chalice Bearer Training 5pm this Wednesday

Eucharistic ministers represent the people at the table on Sunday mornings and they help the celebrant as well as leading the Prayer of the People. Chalice Bearers assist in administering the communion cup. If you would like to participate in this ministry, you have to be licensed by the Bishop. Licenses have to be renewed every three years so if you are a Eucharistic Minister but can't remember when you last went to a training, it's probably time. This training will be in two parts: theory and practice. Part 1 will be on Wednesday May 16 5-6:45 pm and Part2 the following week May 23, also 5–6:45 pm.



Heart of Christianity discussion begins this week on Thursday. This 5-week study, based on the book by Marcus Borg, is an opportunity to rethink the basic tenets of our Christian faith together. This class also serves as preparation for confirmation, reception

or renewal of vows when the Bishop makes her official visitation to St. Benedicts on June 17.

May is Milk Month

This month our Prado focus is on Milk. Consider donating UHT milk (Ultra-High Temperature), a form of pasteurization that gives milk a long shelf life -- no refrigeration needed until after opening -- or other drinks such as soy or almond, for the breakfast program in May. The Prado Day Center can always use hygiene items, peanut butter and jelly, juice, instant cereal and dry cereal, coffee and creamers, paper plates and bowls, utensils, backpacks in good condition, new socks, laundry detergent, and canned goods such as soup, chili, and tuna fish.

For Such a Time As This: Veteran Programs

The Episcopal Church and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America continue our united call to Pray, Fast, and Act in support of good policies and programs that provide opportunities for and respect the dignity of all people.

This month we focus on programs that assist veterans and their family members. New investments and policies in recent years have helped expand veteran access to education, labor opportunities, healthcare, and housing. Still, too many veterans, active service members and their families still struggle with complex challenges—ranging from barriers to benefits to increased mental health risks. We must continue to support those of us who risk everything for the safety and wellbeing of our communities.

Studies from the Department of Veterans Affairs have found that 22 veterans take their lives each day – a rate 21 percent higher when compared to other civilian adults. Some factors, such as the on-going opioid epidemic, have also disproportionately impacted veterans, increasing demand for services among those seeking recovery and contribute to the many challenges impacting families. There is a great need to do more for veterans in our communities. Through chaplains, dioceses, and congregations across the country the Church plays a special role in welcoming returning veterans. Let us take action by asking Congress to protect programs that address the needs and equip veterans as they return from service.

On May 21, join the EPPN and presiding bishops of The Episcopal Church and ELCA as we Pray, Fast, and Act in support of Veterans Programs.

PRAY for those who have answered a vocation of military service and for their families; for the many military chaplains across the world who bear the witness of Christ in word and sacrament; for those who have lost their lives in service of our country and who are moved to harm themselves.
