Why were the Apostles in Jerusalem on that day?

They were gathered for **Pentecost**, or Feasts of Weeks, celebrating the bringing in of the wheat harvest.



Since it occurs 49 days after the first day of Passover (i.e. the 50th day, including Passover itself), Hellenistic Jews gave it the name Pentecost ($\pi\epsilon\nu\tau\eta\kappa\sigma\sigma\tau\dot{\eta}$, or "fiftieth day"). And since 49 days equals seven weeks, it became a "week of weeks". Therefore, they either called it the Feast of Weeks or the Feast of Harvest.

It was a pilgrim festival. According to Jewish Law, all the adult Jewish men would come to Jerusalem from wherever they were living and personally be in attendance during this celebration. It was a holiday. No servile work was to be done. School was out. The shops were closed. It was party time.

It was a grand and joyous celebration. The streets of Jerusalem were clogged with thousands of pilgrims who had come from every point of the compass to celebrate the goodness of God.

When the apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit, it was these visitors who were so astonished to heard them speaking to them in their own foreign language. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, Peter preached boldly to the huge crowd the message of Christ. Many took the gospel message to heart and about 3,000 people were baptized and added to the fledgling Christian church on that Day of Pentecost.

Discovery Day

Annual diocesan spiritual discernment workshop

The Commission on Ministry has announced this year's Discovery Day, an annual workshop on spiritual discernment, to be held **Saturday, June 9**.



Discernment Ministry is a lifelong process of attending, perceiving, listening, and discovering how best to express Christ's ministry through the Church.

Our diocese is entering into a season of spiritual discernment for our next bishop. One of our diocesan values is "Christ-centeredness," asking each of us through prayer, worship, and ministry to deepen our relationship with Jesus so that we may more effectively spread God's love.

Discovery Day offers the opportunity for those already engaged in active ministry to renew their call to a particular ministry, or to explore new ways to respond to God's call. Although this Discovery Day is a required first step to anyone discerning a call to ordained ministry, it is in no way limited to such individuals. We explore and celebrate the ministry of all the baptized, and look at ministry development in each of the four orders – laity, deacons, priests, and bishops.

We will include new information about the opportunity for licensed lay ministries, a way to help people focus on and train for a particular area of ministry in the parish. Previous participants in this process of discernment have used such words as rejuvenating, validating, and transformative to describe their experiences.

Following the Discovery Day workshop, participants may choose to take on a self-guided twelve-week exploration to enhance their appreciation of how the four orders of ministry complement each other in fulfilling the mission of the Church, and discern where they fit into that mission. Members of COM provide support as people work their way through this program. It is required of anyone seeking ordination to the diaconate or priesthood.
