Proper 8: Sunday closest to June 29–Year B

Welcome to our parish. Today's liturgy directs our attention to God's care for the poor and less fortunate. In the Gospel reading we hear the account of Jesus' raising the young daughter of the Jewish official, Jairus. Mark inserts within this story the healing of a woman who had suffered hemorrhages for twelve years. The girl and the woman, by the custom of their times, were both regarded as of little value. But Jesus' compassion extends to them as it does to all people.

In the first reading, Saul has died after losing a battle. With him fell his son, Jonathan, who had, in spite of Saul's hatred for David, become David's dearest friend. David defeats the enemy and then sings the song we hear today praising the heroism of Saul and Jonathan, and in one of the most deeply moving passages in scripture, grieves the death of his dear friend.

Paul calls on the Corinthians to emulate the generosity of other churches in giving to a collection to aid less fortunate Christians. Jesus, Paul reminds us, became poor for us so that we might become rich; that is, he became human so that our humanity might be raised into the life of God. Thus, for the sake of others, we follow Jesus' example and share our own material goods.

We gather in Eucharist as the People of God, called to be the means by which God makes known the divine compassion for all people. It is the poor and neglected in society for whom God is especially concerned as Jesus demonstrated in healing the sick. We are called and given to the world to minister in God's name.

He has performed or recorded with hundreds of musicians including Inga Swearingen, Vocalogy, Royal Garden Swing Orchestra, Human Nation, Marvin Hamlish, Kenny Loggins, Jim Messina, Michael McDonald and more.

The Real Time Jazz All Stars include Dave Becker on saxophone, Marshall Otwell on piano and Dylan Johnson on bass.

Vocalist Julie Kelly moved to Los Angeles in 1980 and shortly after that began her recording career with Pausa Records. Her latest and best vocal CD "Kelly Sings Christy" affirms her complete understanding of the nuances that are so much a part of various ballads associated with June Christy. Julie has worked with such luminaries as Benny Green, Nat Adderley, Ray Brown, John Clayton, Bobby Ojeda, Gary Foster and Alan Broadbent.
