Highlights of the last PC Meeting

- Lyn Wise has been able to un-resign and we welcomed her back on to the Vestry and Parish Council.
- We will celebrate the Gratitude Dinner on October 12 and St Benedict's Day Observed on October 14.
- At Earthcare's request it was agreed that we change to PG&E's solar energy system and also pay \$20 per month for credits to offset our carbon footprint. Most of our carbon footprint comes from people driving to and from church.
- Earthcare's request that we use recycled paper products led to a discussion about whether we could create an app that would enable people to follow the service on their tablets rather than using a paper bulletin as that is our largest paper use apart from in the bathrooms.
- We are grateful for the work of Pamela Bleisch in developing Messy Church. Jennifer Harber will also be an official volunteer so she can provide back-up for Pamela once she has completed the required background checks and training.

Proper 10: Sunday closest to July 13—Year B

Welcome to our parish. Our Gospel reading today is the account of the death of John the Baptist. This well-known story was remembered by the followers of Jesus and John. After this, Jesus' ministry moves ahead with even more urgency, causing rumors that Jesus was John raised from the dead.

Today we begin reading through the Letter to the Ephesians. This beginning portion summarizes the writer's theology of Christ and of our relationship with Christ in the Holy Spirit.

We gather as a people united in God. We, like John and Jesus, are sent into the world with the message of judgment and salvation. We too are called into the ministry of Christ with people in every age and time. Our gathering here is our time to remember who and whose we are and, in that remembering, to be filled once again with the life of Christ. Thus, we go forth proclaiming in our words and our lives the Good News of salvation.

General Convention

The General Convention of the Episcopal Church has completed its work. Among the important decisions that were made:

- to start a process to develop new liturgical material by engaging parishes in the process. This is something we at St Ben's are already engaged in.
- to accept the church in Cuba as a diocese of The Episcopal Church (there are several other national churches such as Ecuador, Columbia and Haiti which are dioceses.)
- agreed to oppose drilling on the Arctic Refuge in solidarity with the indigenous Gwich'in people.
- following a listening liturgy which honored the #MeToo movement and heard personal stories of abuse, harassment and exploitation the Bishops adopted a covenant committing them to make changes aimed to reduce and eliminate such incidents.

Laundry Love is an opportunity for us to make deeper relationships with people who are living on the edge in Los Osos while we share the load of doing laundry with them. St. Benedict's volunteers provide the quarters and detergent for the wash and the dryer while hanging out and taking time to develop relationships. Some of our guests we already know from the Abundance Shop, Community Dinners and the Warming Shelter. Others are new to us. We take over the 10th Street Laundromat on the last Wednesday evening each month from 5pm to 9pm to serve the low and no-income residents of Los Osos.

To keep this going and maybe even expand into twice each month, we need donations of cash and time.
