## Hollister Institute: "A Good Life"

Please join us for our new Hollister Institute Book Study: <u>A Good Life - Benedict's Guide to Everyday Joy</u>, by Robert Benson. This discussion group meets from 3:45-5:30 pm on Tuesdays through October 30. The group facilitators are Caro+ and Roz Malone. Benson offers a warm-hearted, humorous guide to enriching our lives with the wisdom from The Rule of St. Benedict. Participants are encouraged to read Benson's book, which is available from Amazon both new and used. The topic for this week is *Prayer*.

### **Prayer**

- We believe that the divine presence is everywhere and that in every place the eyes of the Lord are watching the good and the wicked. But beyond the least doubt we should believe this to be especially true when we pray.
- Let us consider, then, how we ought to behave in the presence of God, and let us offer our prayer in such a way that our minds are in harmony with our voices.
- We must know that God regards our purity of heart and tears of compunction, not our many words. Prayer should therefore be short and pure, unless perhaps it is prolonged under the inspiration of divine grace. In community, however, prayer should always be brief.
- On hearing the signal for an hour of prayer, we immediately set aside what we have in hand and go with utmost speed, yet with gravity and without giving occasion for frivolity. Indeed, nothing is to be preferred to the Work of God.
- Those who work so far away that they cannot return to the oratory at the proper time are to perform the Work of God where they are. So too, those who must travel are not to omit the prescribed hours but to observe them as best they can, not neglecting their measure of service.
- After the Work of God, all should leave in complete silence and with reverence for God, so that a brother who may wish to pray alone will not be disturbed by the insensitivity of another. Moreover, if at other times, someone wishes to pray privately, he may simply go in and pray, not in a loud voice, but with tears and heartfelt devotion.
- Whenever we want to ask a favor of some powerful man, we do it humbly, and respectfully, for fear of presumption. How much more important, then, to lay our petitions before the Lord God of all things with the utmost humility and sincere devotion.
