Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6th Bishop Mary will be here to bless our new Stations of the Cross sculptures at a special service starting at **7pm**. This will combine a traditional service with imposition of ashes and a pilgrimage through the Stations. The St. Benedict Singers will perform Mendelssohn's "Hear My Prayer." This will be the first time the new station sculptures will be displayed.

Then there will be an Artist's Reception on Sunday, March 10th at 3 pm. This will be an opportunity to meet Chloe A. White and to hear from her experience of creating the Stations. Bob Pelfrey (Art Professor Emeritus, Cuesta College) will also speak about the work and historical significance.

Thereafter the Stations of the Cross will be open for public viewing from 10am-12noon on March 12-13-14 and from 1-3pm March 17+24.

Entering the Passion of Jesus

Amy-Jill Levine is an Orthodox Jew who is also a passionate teacher of the New Testament. In this six week series, she places the events of Holy Week firmly in their Jewish context. She writes,

"We will delve into the history and literature of the last days of Jesus' life. We find ways to understand and question our own lives through the stories of his trials and choices. This Lenten journey challenges us to examine our consciences and find out how deepening our relationship with Jesus and the Bible brings us into closer relationship with others and the world."

As we welcome the new interpretation of Jesus' walk to the cross in the Stations of the Cross, this year seems like a good time to revisit and re-acquaint ourselves with the narrative of Jesus' last week from Palm Sunday to Gethsemane.

Whatever your politics, it's hard to deny the sublime beauty of Russian vocal music. Join us in Morro Bay on **March 30** at 2pm at St. Peter's by-the-Sea for a wonderful concert by the *St. Petersburg Men's Ensemble*. After several years' hiatus, the powerhouse *a cappella* male quartet from Russia is returning to St. Peter's with an all-new program. Since 2003, the ensemble has shared its musical gifts, warmth and humor with audiences around the globe. The repertoire encompasses various musical periods and styles, from ancient Russian chants to chorales of Western and East European masters to modern contemporary. Kirill Sokolov, Sergey Shapinsky, Vadim Smanster, and Andrei Volikov, who comprise the quartet, have performed in churches and concert halls around the world for the past 16 years. These concerts reflect their culture and heritage, with a balance of sacred songs by Russian composers and Russian folk songs. The members of the group bring extensive training and experience, including the Glinka Choir School and the St. Petersburg Conservatory. They have sung as guests with many choirs including the State Academic Capella and the Choir of Smolny Cathedral. There is no charge for admission, but a free-will offering will be taken up.
