**Hollister Institute: Sacred Light** presented by Michael Lucas **Sacred Light:** Gothic Light on Saturday March 7 at 3:00pm will examine the origins of the Gothic by Abbot Suger in Paris, inspired by writing attributed to St. Denis, and its lightning-like expansion across northern Europe and especially the English Gothic. Michael's own images will include Durham, Salisbury, Ely, Winchester, and York Cathedrals, Cambridge and Oxford.

**Sacred Light:** Nordic Light on Saturday March 14 at 3:00pm will examine examples of contemporary/post-WW II spiritual architecture from urban and rural Denmark and Finland, rethinking wood, stone, space and light, including works of the great Finnish architect, Alar Aalto.

Michael Lucas is Professor Emeritus in Architecture at Cal Poly, and former Associate Dean for the College of Architecture and Environmental Design. Both talks are free and open to everyone. Donations are welcome.
