We thank you that as his earthly life drew to a close, on the night he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends and said,

"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Then, after supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said,
