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

But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. # Luke 10.25-37

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of Our Savior Jesus Christ According to Luke

## People: Glory to You, Lord Christ.

Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he

saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, `Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

## Sermon

## **Affirmation of Faith**

Let us stand as we are able and affirm our faith in Jesus Christ the Son of God

All:

Though he was divine,he did not cling to equality with God, but made himself nothing.Taking the form of a slave, he was born in human likeness.He humbled himself and was obedient to death,even the death of the cross.Therefore God has raised him on high,and given him the name above every name:that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow,and every voice proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord,to the glory of God the Father.

## **Prayers of the People**

Let us pray for the Church and for the world.

God of love, we pray for your church: For Michael, our Presiding Bishop; Lucinda, our bishop; for all lay and ordained ministers; and for all who seek you in the community of the faithful. Equip us with compassion and love, to carry out your work of reconciliation in the world. God of love, *Hear our prayers for the church*.

God of freedom, we pray for our nation, and all the nations of the world: For peace and unity across barriers of language, color, and creed; for elected and appointed leaders, that they would serve the common good. Inspire all people with courage to speak out against hatred, to actively resist evil. Unite the human family in bonds of love. God of freedom, *Hear our prayers for the world*.

God of justice, we pray for the earth, your creation entrusted to our care: For the animals and birds, the mountains and oceans, and all parts of your creation that have no voice of their own. Stir up in us a thirst for justice that protects the earth and all its resources, that we may leave to our children's children the legacy of beauty and abundance that you have given us. God of justice, *Hear our prayers for the earth*.

God of peace, we pray for this community: For our local leaders; for our schools and markets; for our neighborhoods and workplaces. Kindle in every heart a desire for equality, respect, and opportunity for all. Give us courage to strive for justice and peace among all people, beginning here at home.

God of peace, Hear our prayers for this community.

God of mercy, we pray for all in any kind of need or trouble: For those whose lives are closely linked with ours, and those connected to us as part of the human family.

For refugees and prisoners; for the sick and suffering, the lonely and despairing; for those facing violence; for all held down by prejudice or injustice. Awaken in us compassion and humility of spirit, as we seek and serve Christ in all persons.

God of mercy, Hear our prayers for all who are in need.

God of grace, we pray for those who have died: For the faithful in every generation who have worked for justice; for prophets who called us to racial reconciliation; for martyrs who died because of hatred; and for all the communion of saints. Make us faithful to your call to proclaim your Good News, by word and example, and bring us at last into the glorious company of the saints in light.

God of grace, Hear our prayers for those who have died.

Celebrant: Hear our prayers, Holy God. Breathe your Spirit over us and all the earth, that barriers would crumble and divisions cease. Make us more fully your co-healers of the broken world. Unite us with all people in bonds of love, that the whole earth and all its peoples may be at peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## **Confession and Absolution**

Celebrant: Let us confess our sins against God and one another.

All: All-Compassionate God, Source of all that is, Giver of every good gift: You create all people in your image and call us to love one another as you love us. We confess that we have failed to honor you in the great diversity of the human family. We have desired to live in freedom, while building walls between ourselves and others. We have longed to be known and accepted for who we are, while making judgments of others based on the color of skin, or the shape of features, or the varieties of human experience. We have tried to love our neighbors individually while yet benefitting from systems that hold those same neighbors in oppression. Forgive us, Holy God. Give us eyes to see you as you are revealed in all people. Strengthen us for the work of reconciliation rooted in love. Restore us in your image, to be beloved community, united in our diversity, even as you are one with Christ and the Spirit, Holy and undivided Trinity, now and for ever.

Celebrant: May our God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, grant us courage and conviction, and strengthen us to love others who are unlike us. May God, the Holy and Undivided Trinity, make us compassionate in our actions and courageous in our works, that we may see Christ's Beloved Community in our own day. Amen.

## **Holy Eucharist**




- Celebrant: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Celebrant: It is our joy and our delight to give thanks to you our Creator God for the wonder of Creation; for the signs of your presence in all life and particularly in the life of your people.

You have filled creation with diversity; just as you created birds in many colors, fish in many sizes and shapes, and mammals in amazing variety, so too you have made humanity a rainbow nation, each one of us with unique personalities and gifts. We thank you that you reveal yourself within your people – each one manifesting your light; the prophets and poets bring us your word, the artists your beauty, the craftspeople and homemakers your order and your hospitality.

And so we take our place alongside the angels, archangels and all who have gone before us as we sing the song which echoes through the ages:





Celebrant: Your Word, incarnate in Jesus, walked among us, teaching us your ways, showing us how to be your daughters and sons, releasing the captives and setting slaves free.

Jesus talked deeply with women, with foreigners, with the outcasts of society, looking beyond superficial social differences to the true person within. He demonstrated your love to those who came to him looking for a deeper knowledge of you; and he did not shrink from the inevitable conflict with those in positions of privilege. He stayed true to your path to the bitter end, and so he died, a victim of human power structures.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, Christ Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said,

"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said,

"Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Recalling now his suffering and death, and celebrating his resurrection and ascension, we await his coming in glory. Accept, O Lord, our sacrifice of praise, this memorial of our redemption.

#### May our lives be radiant with your praise and glory.

Send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts. Let them be for us the Body and Blood of your Son.

And grant that we who eat this bread and drink this cup may be filled with your life and goodness. May we have the courage to show forth your life in the world, loving and forgiving, walking the path of non-violence as Jesus did.

Enable us to see with your eyes, and make us into one holy people of God with all your people of every kind. This we ask through your son Jesus Christ.




