

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of Our Savior Jesus Christ According to John


## People: Glory to You, Lord Christ.


#### Sermon

## 52. For an Anniversary p 431




## 53. For Travelers p 831

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. # **The Lord's Prayer**


As our Savior Christ has taught us, we now pray


