About that time Caesar Augustus ordered a census to be taken throughout the Empire. This was the first census when Quirinius was governor of Syria. Everyone had to travel to his own ancestral hometown to be accounted for. So Joseph went from the Galilean town of Nazareth up to Bethlehem in Judah, David’s town, for the census. As a descendant of David, he had to go there. He went with Mary, his fiancée, who was pregnant. While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. She gave birth to a son, her firstborn. She wrapped him in a blanket and laid him in a manger, because there was no room in the hostel. There were shepherds camping in the neighborhood. They had set night watches over their sheep. Suddenly, God’s angel stood among them and God’s glory blazed around them. They were terrified. The angel said, “Don’t be afraid. I’m here to announce a great and joyful event that is meant for everybody, worldwide: A Savior has just been born in David’s town, a Savior who is Messiah and Master. This is what you’re to look for: a baby wrapped in a blanket and lying in a manger.” At once the angel was joined by a huge angelic choir singing God’s praises:

Glory to God in the heavenly heights,
 Peace to all men and women on earth who please him.

We give thanks to you, because although we keep thinking we can do everything better on our own without your help, you never give up on us, but keep calling us back to walk in love and fellowship with you. We thank you that you sent your Son, Jesus, to be born as a tiny baby just like us and that through him the world is transformed, every day being brought closer toward the dream that you dream for humanity and the planet Earth.

We thank you that as his earthly life drew to a close, on the night he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends and said,

“Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me.”

Then, after supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said,

“Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”

By doing this, Jesus invited us into a closer and deeper relationship with you. Creator God, we now celebrate the memorial of your Son. By means of this holy bread and cup, we show forth the sacrifice of his death, and proclaim his resurrection, until he comes again. Send your Holy Spirit upon this bread and this wine that it may be for us the body and blood of your Son, binding us all together into one body, one people. Send the Holy Spirit to bless us as well so that we may be your hands and feet in our families and the world.

All: ***Gather us by this Holy Communion
into one body in your Son Jesus Christ.
Make us a living sacrifice of praise.***

*By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit
all honor and glory is yours, All Gracious Father, now and for ever.
AMEN.*
