Accomplishments

- The City of SLO declared a commitment to carbon neutrality by 2035
- Community Choice Energy - a community-driven clean energy utility- was created on the Central Coast in order to power our community with clean energy and to accelerate decarbonization.
- Clean Energy choice standards have been adopted by the City of SLO to encourage clean, efficient, and cost effective all-electric new buildings through incentives and local amendments to the Building Code
- A People Centric Climate Action Plan has been adopted by the City of SLO
- National Drive Electric Week events have been produced locally for the past three years - with attendance and interest dramatically increasing

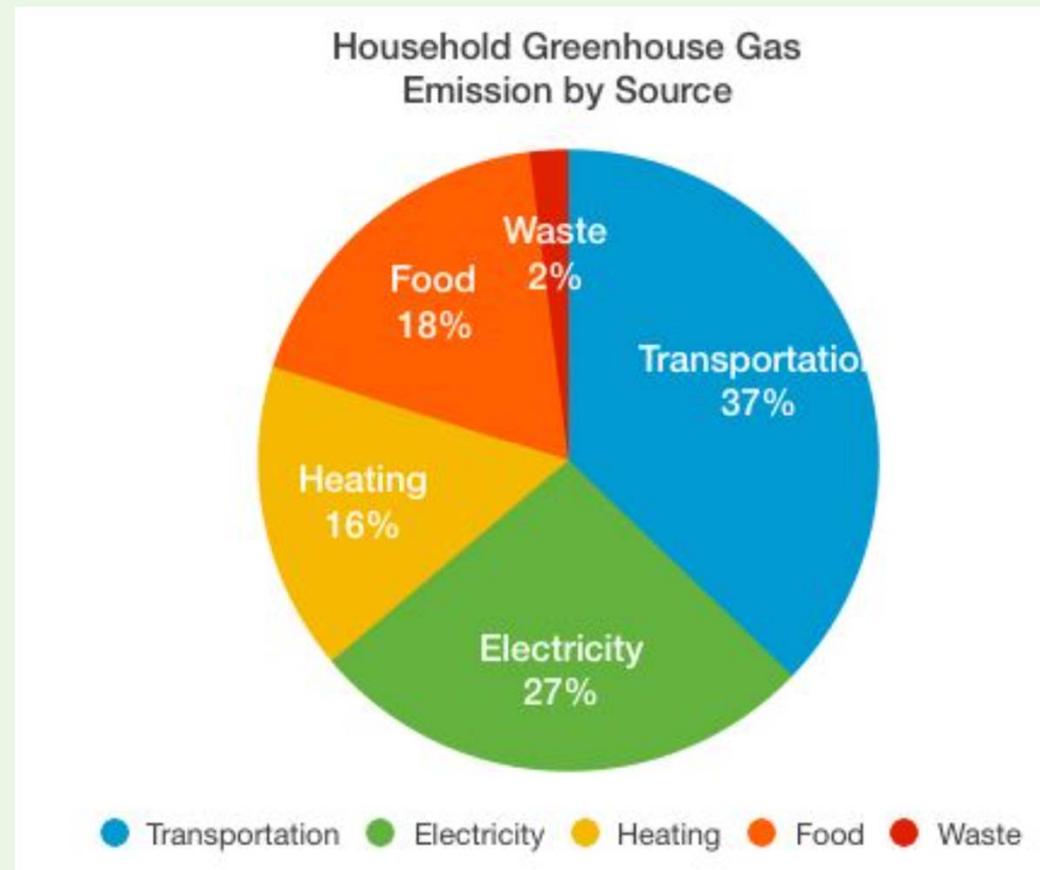


You can make a difference
