Exodus 24:12-18


A Reading from the book of Exodus Reader:

The LORD said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them."

Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. The glory of the LORD settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. Now the appearance of the glory of the LORD was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Matthew 17:1-9

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of Our Savior Jesus Christ According to Matthew

People: Glory to You, Lord Christ.

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

Sermon The Rev. Dr. Caroline Hall

[We pause for a few moments' reflection before affirming our faith.]

Affirmation of Faith cf Philippians 2.6-11

Let us affirm our faith in Jesus Christ the Son of God.

All: **Though he was divine**,

he did not cling to equality with God, but made himself nothing. Taking the form of a slave, he was born in human likeness. He humbled himself and was obedient to death, even the death of the cross.

Therefore God has raised him on high, and given him the name above every name: that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, and every voice proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Prayers of the People

Transcendent God, bless your church that it may reflect your glory, that it may guide your people into the ways of love and peace. We pray for the church as it seeks to uphold your law and to discover your will, that we may be faithful to you until the day dawns and the morning star rises in our hearts. Enable us to proclaim your kin-dom and your glory. Good and gracious God, *grant us a glimpse of your glory*.

Compassionate God, we remember before you the nations of the world; all those who are suffering from earthquake, storm, drought and war and those who carry the burden of leadership. May your grace bring them the help and comfort that they need. Good and gracious God, *grant us a glimpse of your glory*.

We pray for a world that so often has lost its way, a world without standards, without direction. We pray for all whose life has no purpose or meaning, for all who are confused and needing guidance. Good and gracious God, *grant us a glimpse of your glory*.

Holy One, transform our lives by a vision of your glory. Transform our work by an awareness of your presence. Transform our homes by a knowledge of your love. Transform our relationships by our being with you. Good and gracious God, *grant us a glimpse of your glory*.

All-merciful One, transform our hospitals by your power, transform our fears by your love, transform our darkness by your light. We remember before you all who need your transforming power, especially those whose lives are closely linked with ours, starting with those in our bidding book...

[Prayers are read from the bidding book; the people may offer additional prayers, either silently or aloud.]

Good and gracious God, grant us a glimpse of your glory.

Eternal God, transform our fear of death by our knowing you. We remember before you loved ones already transformed in likeness to your glory. Good and gracious God, *grant us a glimpse of your glory*.

Almighty God, change us and we shall be changed, transform us by your love, redeem us by your grace, strengthen us by your presence, that we may move from glory to glory; through Christ our Lord, who with the Holy Spirit reigns with you, O Father, in glory everlasting. Amen.






People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

The Celebrant continues

In your infinite love and wisdom, you sent your Son, your very essence, to be incarnate as a human, to show us the path you have called us to walk on, the path of generosity, love and holiness.

Jesus the Christ challenged our limited thinking and demonstrated that you are a God of glory, a God who transcends all human barriers. He gave us glimpses of our true life in you, and he demonstrated life in the reign of God through compassion and forgiveness. Living among us, Jesus taught us to forgive, to show mercy and to love all beings. Through his obedience to his own calling he brought salvation to the whole creation, and taught us to walk in his footsteps. Even at the last he chose a path of nonviolence and forgave those who taunted, tortured and crucified him.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,

"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you.

Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins.

Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."


Recalling now his suffering and death, and celebrating his resurrection and ascension, we await his coming in glory. Accept, O God, our sacrifice of praise, this memorial of our redemption. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, All Compassionate Creator, now and for ever. Amen.



This is God's table, and all are welcome here.




