A Report from Your Search Committee

With Rev. Caro's retirement at the end of May, the work of the Transition Team has ended and the work of the Search Committee has begun. The Parish Council has appointed a 7-member Search Committee to complete the work of writing the Parish Profile, screen and interview candidates who apply, and to recommend a minimum of two candidates to the Parish Council for final consideration and call by the Parish Council. Note that the Vestry chose to pursue a "Search in Place" process, which meant we conducted many transition-related activities while Rev. Caro was still serving as Rector.

The current focus of the Search Committee is to review the extensive collection of materials created and gathered during the Transition Team and to complete the Parish Profile, a draft of which was developed by the Transition Team. A key focus is to write the "Who We Seek" section, which was intentionally left for the Search Committee, as Canon Martha (who serves as our Consultant for the Transition and Search process) felt it important that those who are interviewing candidates should write the words of the job description. The basic parameters of our call will be a 3/4-time position, with salary and housing based on the diocesan guidelines.

Our hope is to complete the draft of the Parish Profile in August, at which point we will seek feedback and approval from the Parish Council, Canon Martha, and the bishop. We will also share the profile with the congregation when it is ready. Once complete, the profile will be made available in the customary places for job postings of this kind (as well as our website), and we will begin reviewing candidates as they apply.

None of us, of course, can predict how long this process will require. As the Diocesan Transition Manual says, "it takes as long as it takes". That said, we are in a good position, having gathered a lot of important information during the first half of the year, to complete our profile and to be ready to talk to interested candidates in the coming weeks and months.

Please pray for the work of the committee, and our congregation as a whole, as we navigate this time of change and uncertainty.

The members of the Search Committee are: Michael Lucas, Brian Spolarich, and Jane Wu (all continuing members of the Transition Team), as well as Letty Cotta, Diana Hammerlund, Barbara Hirahara, and Bob Pelfrey. Please contact any of us if you have questions or concerns.

Highlights from the Parish Council

Did you know that during the interim between when the former rector leaves and the new rector arrives, the parish council is charged with overseeing the day-to-day operations of the parish? This means paying even more attention to administrative support, on-going ministry teams, the buildings and grounds, church finances, congregational reporting to the diocese, communications, and pastoral care. The parish council also ensures that the positions dictated by their by-laws and the Canons of The Episcopal Church are staffed and working smoothly: Presiding Warden, People's Warden, Clerk of the Vestry, and Treasurer.

As our Presiding Warden, Maureen will continue to be in regular contact with the bishop with information about what is happening in the parish and any questions that arise. The Presiding Warden ensures that parish council meetings continue at least monthly, and that the meetings are led faithfully and effectively. The council has chosen the Search Committee, which functions as a sub-committee of the council. The council will stay in regular contact with the Search Committee and supports their work as needed.

Thank you all for your prayers and encouragement during this time of many extra tasks and responsibility.

Finances

We are halfway through our fiscal year and continue to be in a good financial position. Income is over budget due to early payment of pledges and strong Abundance Shop sales. The impact of the rector transition and open music director position mean we continue to see lower expenses due to reduced salary and benefits. The combined effect puts us \$52k ahead of budget year-to-date. Thanks be to God! Looking ahead, it is important to remember that over a multiyear period, the trend is toward fewer pledge dollars. Once we have our new rector and music director onboard, we will have more consistent salary obligations. Thank you in advance to our Finance Committee as they help us manage these changes.








Farewell Service

Before Caro+ left St. Benedict's, she spent some intensive hours working with the Liturgy Committee, sharing information and her experience regarding the creation and support of Sunday services.

During this transition time, we will be utilizing a combination of supply priests, licensed lay preachers, and our own Trailblazer, Rev. Jen Crompton. We are fortunate to have retired clergy and licensed lay preachers in our own congregation!

Our Presiding Warden, Maureen Titus, is responsible for recruiting celebrants. The liturgists (members of the Liturgy Committee) construct services (prayers to hymns) from The Episcopal Church approved sources. If we have no musician, Hannah Jaye locates a recorded version for our use. Jenmuse Smith and Hannah-Jaye wrap it up into a stunning website and a hard copy bulletin, making a very complex job seem easy.

Between the service design phase and the completed bulletin, a lot of research, proof-reading, and consultation occurs. The Liturgy Committee meets weekly to conduct quality improvement on the previous Sunday and to plan for the next weeks.

This is indeed a service mission that has humbled us all. Please be patient and pray for us as we proceed onward.
